From Chapter Three:

"It is not uncommon for someone to be in constant communication with another person daily, hourly, or even several times within a single minute, but all the information sent into the digital space has the potential to linger in the indefinitely and becomes part of our digital footprint or the "digital traces each one of us leaves behind as we conduct our lives" (Weaver & Gahegan, 2007)."

Using Incognito mode in Google Chrome (or a similar feature in another browser), Google yourself. What comes up in the results? If you were your student, how would you feel about these results? How can you clean your digital footprint?

In your groups, share your draft infographic with your groupmates and ask them to use the 5 indicators you have created in week 2 to conduct evaluation and provide feedback.
